We practice on Mondays - Friday, June 19 - July 7, 2023 from 9:00am to 3:00pm with games, breaks and rehearsal time to learn their lines, songs and dances for Moana Jr. All kids will be cast after an audition on the 1st day. There will also be 2 performances Friday, July 7th @5:00pm and Saturday, July 8th @3:00pm.

Where is the camp and performance located

The camp and performances will be held at Wentz Church's community room 3246 W Skippack Pike, Lansdale (near Skippack).

What are the requirements

We work with many schedules but have certain practices that are required for you to attend: first Practice, Tech & Dress Rehearsal Week. Each performer will receive a t-shirt to wear for the performances and should wear it with dark jeans, pants or leggings.

You will be required to bring water, snacks (am & pm) along with lunch.
